## NORTON CEVC PRIMARY SCHOOL

At the time of writing, the Autumn Half Term holiday is nearly upon us. The weather has taken a distinctly autumnal turn and, after a typically jam-packed first six weeks, it is time for a well-earned break for children and staff alike. Looking back over the last month, it has been pleasing to note the variety of sporting activities that have provided so many children with an opportunity to take part and challenge themselves.

Following the success of September's residential visit, Year 6 were out again, attending a transition event at Thurston Community College. Several primary schools came together for a morning of outdoor adventurous and problem-solving activities, led by sports leaders from the high school. The children were split into groups with those from other schools and challenged both to introduce themselves *and* learn some new names and faces; then, the events were under way. This was the first of many transition events of the year, which aim to ensure the children are ready for the step up to secondary school.

A week later, Year 6 took part in a cross-country running event at Stowupland High School. All children completed the 2km course, and one of our girls, the first to finish, made it to the finals event at the Royal Hospital School in Holbrook. Then it was the turn of a group of Year 3 and 4 pupils headed off after school to Ixworth Free School to participate in a tag rugby event. The children mixed with those of other schools to develop some key skills, such as passing and running with the ball.

Just last week, dance coaches from Premier Sports, providers of both curricular and extra-curricular sports activities to the school, put all the children from reception to Year 6 through their paces. The theme for this exciting enrichment day was Divali, the Hindu festival of light, and each class learnt and performed a dance of celebration.

Aside from sport and games, Key Stage 2 children headed over the road to the Norton Baptist Church on the 4<sup>th</sup> October, coming together in the always eagerly-anticipated celebration of harvest. The service, which included a presentation by Captain Andrew Jarrold of the Salvation Army, proved very thought-provoking with some sobering facts about poverty at home in Britain as well as around the world. Accompanying a presentation by each of the Key Stage 2 classes, songs and prayers were offered by the children, with a collection of non-perishable food items being sent to Gateway Foodbank

On a personal note, it was a privilege to attend a recent talk at Pakenham Church, introduced by Chris and Angie Dawkins, by Thomas Shavu from the Diocese of Kagera in Tanzania. Thomas, who had visited classes back in September, told of the climate change, deforestation, extremes of drought and torrential rains, and the genocide in neighbouring Rwanda, all of which continue to impact immeasurably on the people of Kagera. The school has a historic link with this diocese which we now look forward to developing further.

While events and projects such as we have seen over the past month continue to add colour to our curriculum, it has also been good to note how well each class has been settling down to the day to day routines and ways of working of their new teachers. The children are exercising all their learning muscles but busy timetables mean that there is still a lot to be covered before Christmas - very soon, the half term break will seem like a distant memory!

Last month, Mervyn Russen gave us a wonderfully informative talk on the First Railway to Ipswich & Beyond (including Elmswell), detailing the construction of the tunnel through Ipswich Stoke Hill (with some amazing “before” and “after” pictures), the teams of navvies and miners who did the really hard graft, as well as the financial backers and engineers who enabled all this to happen. The main railway engineer, Ipswich’s own Thomas Brassey, has recently been honoured with a blue plaque in the town. We had a bumper audience to learn all about this local slice of social and economic history, which was much appreciated by our speaker.

### **8<sup>th</sup> November – “History of local company, Fisons”, illustrated talk by Kelvin Dakin**

Kelvin’s talk will inform us of this famous factory in Bramford, on land first developed in the mid-1800s, and now a Grade 2-listed warehouse, said to be Suffolk’s largest listed building. It was once home to a thriving company and workforce in the heart of the county, and is an icon of Suffolk’s industrial past. Our December tickets (£3 or £5) will also be for sale that evening.

### **13<sup>th</sup> December – “The True Story of Hereward the Wake of Ely”, told in words and music by folk group, The Penland Phezants, and will include mention of local king and martyr, St Edmund.**

As always, our December meeting is by **advance-purchased** ticket only, i.e. none available on the door that night, so do buy your ticket (£3 for members, or £5 for visitors) at our November meeting detailed above, or ring 01359-242601 for tickets and more details.

The ticket price includes light seasonal refreshments.


